






2018 ATAR* Scores at St Michael's Collegiate



What is the Rhodes Scholarship?

The Rhodes Scholarship is the oldest (first awarded in 1902) and perhaps most prestigious international scholarship programme, enabling outstanding young people from around the world to study at the University of Oxford.

The award is very difficult to attain. There are only NINE students (across Australia), awarded a Rhodes Scholarship each year.

The Hutchins School has 24 old boys in total who have received a Rhodes Scholarship award. This is outstanding academic recognition for old boys of The Hutchins School. Hutchins is very proud of its past students.

Henry West (old boy 2011) was Hutchins' latest and 24th student to gain a Rhodes Scholarship. Henry, 24, completed his medical training at the **University of Tasmania**, where his passion lies in preventing cardiovascular disease. He will study his doctoral degree at **University of Oxford, UK**.

In Year 12 Henry was a House Captain at Hutchins, involved in a large number of co-curricular activities at both a House and School level, and was an outstanding academic.



BOYS AND GIRLS

A residential ELICOS program opened to international students (both boys and girls) aged 12–16 years as of 1 July in that Australian school calendar year.

The program is for students who require a 10, 20 – up to 40 week English language preparation course prior to integration into the Australian Curriculum.

Students will be accommodated at The Hutchins School boarding residence (boys) and St Michael's Collegiate School boarding residence (girls).

Girls and Boys do <u>NOT</u> have to be enrolling into The Hutchins School or into St Michael's Collegiate School – they can be applying to ANY school (in Tasmania or interstate) however need weeks of High School Preparation English prior to commencement.

A Certificate of Completion of ELICOS high school preparation course and weeks undertaken will be issued to each student.

The course is delivered in its own Centre for ELICOS on the Hutchins School campus – students boarding at the girls' school will be transported each day.

As places will eventually be limited – preference WILL be given to students continuing education at Hutchins or Collegiate Schools.

AGENTS will earn referral commission by The Hutchins ELICOS Centre for students entering this ELICOS course – separate to school commission.
